



Gender Equality in Bulgaria



EQUALITY

Bulgaria ranks 22nd out of 142 countries in the 2014 ranking of World Economic Forum on workplace equality between men and women.



EMPLOYMENT

The employment rate of women is at 56.3%, which is close to the EU- 27 average (58.6%). However, the female employment rate is still 5.0 percentage points (pp) below the male employment rate (61.3%).



PAY GAP

The **gender pay gap** lies at 13.0% and is below the EU-27 average (16.2%) (Source: Eurostat)



INCOME

Women have an average annual income of \$13,130, and men - \$19,115 (Source: World Economic Forum)


HORIZONTAL SEGREGATION

Compared to the EU-27, the under-/overrepresentation of women and men (horizontal segregation) is less pronounced regarding sectors but equally pronounced regarding occupations.



VERTICAL SEGREGATION

The under-/overrepresentation of women and men on hierarchical levels (vertical segregation) is more pronounced in Bulgaria than in EU-27. 12.0% of board positions (EU-27: 16%) and 31.0% of management positions are held by women (EU-27: 33%).



Legal framework of gender equality in Bulgaria



CONSTITUTION

The Constitution of the Republic of Bulgaria guarantees the fundamental human rights and freedoms of the Bulgarian citizens, including nondiscrimination on the grounds of sex.



LAW AGAINST DISCRIMINATION

The Law on Protection against Discrimination, in force since 2004, incorporates the principle of equal pay and prohibition of all kinds of discrimination.



LABOUR CODE

The Labour Code prohibits all forms of discrimination and restrictions based on gender and introduces the principle of equal pay for women and men.



LAW ON GENDER EQUALITY

No Law on Gender Equality has been adopted so far.
